### Staff Report:

- Waivers given to drinking water systems being rescinded.
- Waste water surveillance program sampling for COVID-19, being done by DES and analyzed by NYS. Will expand to test for Hepatitis A, Norovirus, and Polio.
- CIP 2024-2029 proceeding to planning board. Phase 2 on the way, with first public workshop in mid-March.

## Meeting Topic(s):

Genesee River Watch George Thomas, Executive Director

- Mission: To champion solutions that improve the quality of the Genesee and initiatives that connect people to the river.
- Genesee River basin begins in Potter County, Pennsylvania. "Upper" Genesee is considered more accessible. "Middle" runs from Mt. Morris to Scottsville. "Lower" runs to mouth.
- Issues facing the river:
  - Erosion, which causes high phosphorous levels, high sediment levels, and loss of valuable farmland. Erosion is caused by food processing and waste water plants, and runoff from fertilizer, manure, and septic systems.
  - o Dredging.
- SUNY Brockport Genesee River Basin Study: Work conducted over 3 years to monitor and model the quality of the river. Concluded that streambank erosion significantly contributes to sediment and nutrient loads in the Genesee River Basin.
- Genesee River Watch designs, obtains funding for, and executes projects to improve river quality. Focuses include streambank restoration, working with landowners to gage interest, and solicit funding.
  - First completed project was at Mallard Dairy \$150,000 project completed in 2018. Other projects have begun and been completed since.
- Planting vegetation reduces soil erosion.
- Grant to work on agricultural best practices. 30-40 years needed in order to make real, measurable improvements in water quality.
