Pactech Packaging, Inc.

Pactech Packaging is a locally based supplier of innovative flexible packaging that was founded in 1991. Pactech designs and manufactures bags for a variety of industries including: agriculture, chemical, military, pharmaceutical and medical. Many of the clients are Fortune 500 companies.



Pactech recently moved to an existing 127,000 square foot facility located at 2605 Manitou Road in Ogden. Pactech has invested \$4.7 million to purchase, renovate and equip this space and have transformed it into a world-class facility that will give the company plenty of room to grow. Pactech utilized Monroe County's SBA 504 program to purchase and renovate the facility.

County Executive Maggie Brooks recently attended the ribbon cutting at Pactech and said, "Businesses have choices on where they want to be located. We are grateful the incentives offered through our Economic Development division were a deciding factor in Pactech staying in our community."

Pactech currently employs 65 and President Chad Buchta said he expects to grow the company and employ 90 by 2016.

NEW PROGRAM Monroe on the Job

County Executive Maggie Brooks recently announced a new skilled trades program designed to connect available workers in the community with skilled jobs. The Monroe on the Job program will offset the cost of putting employees through qualified certification programs, by allocating \$4,000 to any manufacturer or skilled trades company that makes its own financial commitment to training new workers.
