Educate the public on stormwater pollution through the H2O Hero Campaign which includes school and community presentations, exhibits (Rochester Museum & Science Center (RMSC), Seneca Park Zoo, and Ontario Beach Park), mass media advertising, a website, social media, and educational signage.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

Metrics not included elsewhere in this report include 16,511 visitors to the H2O Hero website and 494 followers on the H2O Hero facebook page. During this reporting period, 46 educational posts were made on facebook reaching 9,293 users. Six (6) radio ads were run and seven (7) online ads. Two hundred (200) pet waste signs were produced as well as seven (7) green infrastructure signs. A new green infrastructure exhibit was completed at the RMSC.

New educational signage will be installed at stormwater mgmt facilities and demonstration projects. A professional marketing survey is performed on a regular schedule to measure the impact of the campaign.

Reduce stormwater pollution associated with municipal facilities and operations to the maximum extent possible. Train staff on stormwater pollution prevention. Provide assistance to residents on proper disposal of hazardous materials.

During this reporting period, the Stormwater Coalition contracted with a consultant to provide technical assistance to the members MS4s in performing pollution prevention assessments of municipal facilities and operations. Pollution prevention assessments were performed for eight (8) municipalities. The Monroe County Eco Park is open twice weekly for residents to bring household hazardous waste, electronics, and recyclables. There are six (6) mobile municipal hazardous waste collection events from April - October where residents can bring waste. These events are highly utilized.

The Coalition has re-established the Illicit Discharge / Pollution Prevention Task Group to provide oversight of its compliance programs and advance priority projects.
